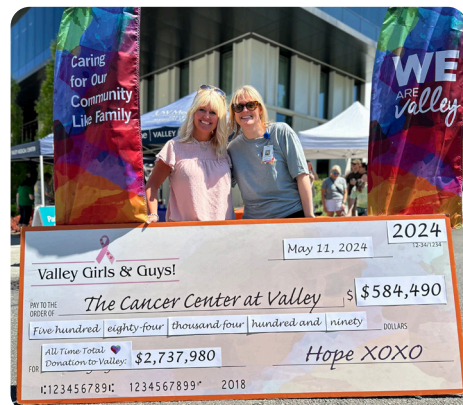

Valley Medical Center's New Cancer Center Set to Open February 3, 2025!

We are thrilled to announce the opening of the first phase of Valley Medical Center's new Cancer Center, welcoming our first patients on February 3, 2025. This innovative and healing space will provide integrated, compassionate cancer care with advanced treatment and specialized services specifically designed to support oncology patients and their loved ones – all under one roof.



This initial phase includes our new Infusion Center with 40% greater capacity, Fast Track Rooms, Compounding Pharmacy, Acute Symptom Management Clinic, and the Trapper & Samantha Wellbeing Support Center.



Cancer continues to be the leading cause of illness and death within our district, and we know that patients are better served when they can get treatment closer to home, at an institution they know and trust, with family and friends by their side.

THIS NEW FACILITY WILL PROVIDE A BEACON OF HOPE, WITHIN AN EXPANDED AND TRANQUIL NEW SPACE, FOR OUR GROWING NUMBER OF PATIENTS IN NEED.

This incredible milestone would not be possible without the support of our Board of Trustees; senior leadership; oncology leaders, providers, and caregivers; our lead donor and longtime supporter, Valley Girls & Guys!; and over 500 individual and corporate donors who have made this a reality.
