Welcome to the Team! New Providers at Valley




Welcome to Valley's two new primary care providers and our new urogynecologist.


Show Me the Way - Become a Valley Wayfinding Volunteer





Organ Donors Like Rachel Save Lives



Rachel was a funny, vibrant young woman, and a paraeducator and basketball coach at the Muckleshoot Tribal School in Auburn. It was a heartbreaking tragedy when she passed away at age 23. But her legacy lives on because she was registered as an organ donor, saving the lives of seven people and restoring sight to two others. "I'm very proud of her decision to donate," said her mother, Laura. "She always thought about the bigger picture and other people. She didn't want people to suffer, and she accomplished that." More than 100,000 people in the United States are on the transplant waiting
